


May God fill us all with hope, endurance and joy this Easter season to continue to follow our Risen Lord who has suffered, died and risen in great glory.

NEW LIFE – GOD'S BLESSING AT EASTER

"If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new." 2 Corinthians 5:17

Rebirth can be a difficult concept to understand, but the lovely little butterfly offers a picture of what takes place when Christ comes into a human heart. The caterpillar's metamorphosis provides a wonderful illustration for our spiritual transformation.

Now some people may think caterpillars are cute, some may think that they are amusing, but probably no one would say they are beautiful. A caterpillar is a worm -- and worms are not beautiful! Then, one day the caterpillar spins a cocoon about him and stays there for several weeks. When it comes out, it is no longer a caterpillar, it has been miraculously changed into a beautiful butterfly.

Somehow, the miracle of the butterfly never loses its fascination for us. Perhaps because the butterfly is a living parable of the promise of resurrection!




The butterfly does not return to the caterpillar state; nor can it return to the pupa phase. When a butterfly emerges from its cocoon, it flies — something it couldn't do before! The butterfly also drinks sweet nectar instead of gorging on leaves. Are you a new creation in Christ still trying to crawl back inside the cocoon to live as you once lived? Even if you could go back in time, leaves would no longer nourish you and the torn cocoon would no longer protect you. Because God has transformed you into a new creation! Now you have the blessed privilege and opportunity to soar in His power and do His work on this planet. So spread your wings into their full, beautiful glory. It's time to fly.

What do we say in the face of death? There are many mysteries. But two things we know for sure. First, death is an enemy. But second, and more important, Jesus' resurrection from the grave is God's proof to us that death is not the end. The empty tomb and Jesus' Spirit within us testify that Easter morning is God's triumph over death. And ultimately, Jesus promised, God will raise us from the dead who believe in His Son.

NEWS FROM SHIMOGA SCBA

Greetings in the name of Jesus our Lord! We are happy to share the tit-bits of our association at Mary Immaculate Convent, Shimoga.



We had virtual meetings and whenever possible, offline meetings in Mary Immaculate convent itself.

Two SCB Associates, accompanied Sr.

Elize and the novices: Sr. Roseline and Sr. Ashaja to attend a programme arranged by personnel of prison ministry. Clothes, Rosaries and fruit were distributed to the inmates by Associates.



A rich man of our neighbourhood, who was very good to the poor and the destitute, lost all his belongings and became blind due to his illness. He was helped with good amount of money by S.C.B. Associates and they have informed others too, to do the same towards him.

A neighbor of S.C.B. Associate was suffering from Covid-19. She helped the family with her constant visits and provided necessary stuff needed though money was paid by them. She gave them courage and prayed for them everyday.

On Vocation Sunday, all the SCB Associates came together and prayed for vocations. We also reflected on the life of St. Joseph and decided to pray the rosary, litany and special prayer in honour of St. Joseph during the year of St. Joseph. On the 6th of June the associates met online and prayed for various intentions such as for migrants, sick and the suffering and for souls in purgatory.

On 27th June 2021, we had online prayer meeting. We reflected on the Word of God and shared it with all the members. Each SCB Associate chose 5 families and prayed with them and



shared the Word of God. On 25th July we had the online prayer, sharing on the Word of God and prayed Divine Mercy Chaplet.

ACTS OF MERCY BY THE ASSOCIATES

◆ Every SCB Associate acts as a Good Samaritan, whenever accidents occur in front of their



houses. They give the first aid before the emergency, call for an ambulance and admit the injured to the hospital, thereafter inform the family members and keep visiting till they get better.

- When robbery took place in the neighbourhood, one of the associates was alert enough to inform the police and helped the robbed family to overcome the trauma.
- Most associates visit the sick patients in the hospital and comfort them. Corona infected patients were provided with food daily at their homes and in the hospitals.
- A family with two senior citizens was served food with great love by one of the associates for two months. She also served the Covid patients, fed them and took care of them.
- During the Covid crises, the jobless were provided with midday meal till they found jobs.
 The migrants were provided with food till they returned to their hometown.



- During the lock down individual associates helped the widows with Rs 1000/- each and also helped a Covid positive young boy with Rs.1000/- The associates also made it to visit the houses of the needy, aged and sick, pray with them and reach out to them at this critical time.
- Two children, who were receiving Holy Communion for the first time, were given clothes on their special day.
- Those who were repairing the road next to the house were provided with tea, till they completed the work.
- Three widows were provided with clothes.
 Some economically poor people were helped with cash and kind.
- Degree students and students studying in the primary schools were helped with school fees. Beggars were given food whenever possible. Economically poor students were helped by way of providing books, pencils, pens and uniform.
- Stray dogs, birds and animals are regularly being fed. Water is provided to quench their thirst.
- Social Media Links to attend Mass, adoration and retreat were forwarded to many groups and individuals to facilitate and nourish their spiritual wellbeing.
- On 8th Sept 2021 a SCB Associate wanted to celebrate Mother Mary's birthday quite differently. As she was attending the Mass on this day, her phone rang and two persons in dire need requested her to help. Soon after the Mass she went to these families, accompanied both of them to the doctor, stayed with them in the hospital and saw to their needs.
- One of the associates offers care and protection to a senior citizen who suffers from dementia. She has given her shelter, feeds her, washes her clothes and gives medicine from time to time. Another associate took care of two senior citizens for 40 days.
- Most of the associates distributed gifts during Christmas to the poorest of the poor.

On the 26th of September 2021 SCB Associates assembled in the Cathedral and celebrated the Eucharist as the following day 27th Sept 2021 was the Foundation day of the Congregation.

On the 30th of October 16 associates took part on the virtual zoom meeting conducted by the Western Province. Fr. Peter Balaswamy addressed them on 'Synodality and the role of the lay associates in the Church'. They interacted well and proposed the vote of thanks at the end of the programme.

SCB Associates wished the sisters on our patron's - St. Charles feast day; participated in the Eucharist and shared in the fellowship meal.



The associates also took ac-

tive part in the meetings that were held to discuss about the Synod 2021-23 in the parish as well as in the presbytery.



We celebrated the "World day of the poor" by preparing food packets and distributing them to the poor who were on the streets of Shimoga. One of the associates served fresh and tasty breakfast to five beggars to mark the event.

We watched November Sparks-Part 2 and came to know more about the Congregation.

We went on a pilgrimage to St. Joseph Church, Sagar, on the 22nd of November 2021. There we prayed the Rosary, litany and prayer in honour of St. Joseph and took part in the Eucharistic celebration by Fr. David Dellario.



We also met the parish priest and Vicar General of the diocese Mgr. Felix Joseph Noronha, who was very happy to see us and give us his blessing. We were delighted to be served a hot cup of tea and snacks.



On the 28th of November 2021, we conducted S.C.B. associates meeting in Mary Immaculate Convent and shared all the good works done by us from April 2021 to 28th November 2021. We also watched a film on the life of St. Joseph the husband of Mary and patron of the Universal Church.

We, the core-group of SCBA congratulate and thank Sr Dorothy for the effort taken to compose the song and get the music for the same.





But they continued to take part in incarnating the Compassionate love of God, as they intensely prayed for those who were affected, helped them materially, spent their time and resources in supporting the poor and the needy. One of our Associates, Mrs. Rosy, shares her personal experience of COVID 19 thus...

The Western Province of Sisters of St. Charles Borromeo, India, organized a Webinar on the Synod, on Sunday, 31st October 2021, between 07:00 p.m. and 08:00 p.m.. The webinar was excellently facilitated by Fr. Peter B – CSsR. The webinar besides being an enlightening session on the Synod, also offered the unique opportunity to connect and interact with so many Sisters of the Western Province as also SCB Associates from the different Communities. While this Webinar was in English, Fr. Peter had also facilitated a session in Kannada on the 30th of October.

The Webinar began with a meditative Prayer Service led by Sr. Elizabeth Leo and Team, invoking Blessings of the Holy Spirit. This was followed by a Welcome address by Sr. Rita Shanthi, who also introduced us to the Subject Matter Expert – Fr. Peter.

This was truly an amazing Webinar, as Fr. Peter walked us through the following aspects related to the Synod, stopping at regular intervals to take questions and clarify any doubts.

- What is Synod?
- Fr. Peter explained the origin of the word as also it's history dating back to 1962-65 the First Synod by Pope Paul VI.
- ◆ Types of Synod was the next point to covered, that is the Ordinary Synod – held every four years and focuses on theme in the life of the church and the Special Synod, to address issues of a particular region
- Fr. Peter then shared about the Synod 2021 a
 Pastoral Synod, with the Theme: FOR A
 SYNODAL CHURCH: COMMUNION,
 PARTICIPATION AND MISSION.

The various phases for the Synod are as follows; o Opening of the Synod: 9-10 October at Vatican, 17th October at diocese. o Diocesan Phase (October 2021 to April 2022) o Continental Phase (September 2022 to March 2023) o Universal Church (October 2023).

Fr. Peter then shared some very interesting aspects of the Logo of the Synod, which we appear to have totally missed out on. The large, majestic tree, full of wisdom and light, reaches for the sky.

A sign of deep vitality and hope which expresses the cross of Christ. It carries the Eucharist, which shines like the sun. The horizontal branches, opened like hands, or wings, suggest, at the same time, the Holy Spirit. You will notice that the Bishop and Religious are part of the crowd, and not leading it, thus there is no hierarchy - all walking together, all our included even the sick, the young and the old.

- Next, Fr. Peter led us to reflect on our part in the Synod, vis-à-vis these 3 aspects of how we can;
- Be part of the Community
- Be Part of the preparation of the Synod
- Be part of the Mission
- Fr. Peter concluded by reminding us to Celebrate the Synod by LISTENING, SPEAKING OUT (SHARING God experience) and JOURNEYING TOGETHER. Nobody is saved alone, we can only be saved together. Fr. Peter also conducted a recall Quiz to recap the Session highlights.

The Session concluded with a Vote of Thanks by Charleston Mendonca – SCB Associate – Vakola, Mumbai Community, followed by a few informal interactions among the participants.




Synods and synodality have long been the rule of the Church. The Council of Trent (1545–1563) mandated diocesan synods every year and provincial or metropolitan synods every three years. That was winnowed down to diocesan synods once every 10 years in the 1917 Code of Canon Law. By the time we get to the 1983 code, Canon 461 makes synods entirely dependent on the wishes of bishops and priests.

Unlike the past synods, the Synod on synodailty isn't one about addressing a particular issue but about becoming who God calls us to be as a Church, all of us together, amidst the reality of today's world! The purpose of this synod is not to produce more documents, rather, it is intended to inspire people to dream about the Church we are called to be, to make people's hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts and restore strength to our hands for our common mission.

The aim of the synod is not just to talk about synodality, but to put synodality into practice from now onwards, in every diocese, parish and country across the whole world. This calls all of us, at every level of the Church, to renew our way of being and working together moving forward.

As I was reflecting on the Synod on synodailty a story flashed my mind! The familiar story about the Mud Ball and the Dry Leaf...



A Dry Leaf and a Mud Ball were very good friends. As they approached old age together, they decided to make a religious pilgrimage to a holy city on the banks of the Ganges river. They understood the distance and the dangers of such a trip. They knew that heavy rains and strong winds were the two greatest hazards they would face.

So, they decided on a clever strategy. When the rains poured down, the Dry Leaf would shield the Mud Ball until the storm passed. When the heavy winds blew, the Mud Ball would sit on Dry Leaf until the sandstorm was over. One bright, sunny morning, Dry Leaf and Mud Ball set out on the long, difficult pilgrimage to the holy city. They traveled just a short distance when the sky grew dark and rain began to fall. Dry Leaf shielded Mud Ball until the rain stopped. Their strategy worked, and they laughed as they continued on their way.

As they got further down the road, the sky clouded again, but as they got further down the road, the sky clouded again, but this time, the wind blew in with a terrible force. Mud Ball sat on Dry Leaf until the wind died down. Their strategy still worked, and as they traveled on, they started to sing. They had gotten almost to the holy city before the sky clouded over again.

Then something terrible happened. The rain poured down, and the wind blew — at the same time. Although the two friends tried their best to help each other, it was of no use. Dry Leaf blew away and was never seen again. And Mud Ball was washed away.

There comes a time in life when no matter how much we are loved and helped by another, it's not enough. Even the love and support of our best friends can't help us. A time will come when a help from elsewhere, larger than the mere human, will be your only refuge.



Fundamentally, synodality is about journeying together. This happens through listening to one another in order to hear what God is saying to all of us. It is realizing that the Holy Spirit can speak through anyone to help us walk forward together on our journey as the People of God and finally surrender ourselves to God's will who is beyond our dreams and desires!

"The joys and the hopes, the griefs and the anxieties of the men (people) of this age, especially those who are poor or in any way afflicted, these are the joys and hopes, the griefs and anxieties of the followers of Christ"- words from Vatican II, the Council to which Pope Francis constantly invites us to direct our gaze. Let us learn to be a Church that listens, a Church that wants to know what the men and women of today live, because nothing in their lives is foreign to them.

What is synodality? For some, this may not be a familiar word. We have heard of synods that have been held in Rome from time to time since the Second Vatican Council on various important issues. Every few years, with a different theme. But this time it will be in a different way, it will not only be for some bishops who go to Rome, representing the universal Church. All the baptized will be able to participate.

"Synodality means walking together." This has become a key theme of Pope Francis' pontificate, Archbishop, Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, C.Ss.R., wrote recently. The Pope – following what Vatican II indicated – wants us to learn to walk together, all of us listening to each other and to the Holy Spirit. That is why he wanted this next synod to be a longer process, beginning in the pews of our churches and culminating in Rome, everyone's home.

"The objective of the phase is the consultation of the People of God so that the synodal process is carried out while listening to all the baptized," says the document of the Synod Secretariat, which also adds that "a full synodal process will be carried out in an authentic way only if the particular Churches are involved.



These 15 silhouettes sum up our entire humanity in its diversity of life situations of generations and origins. This aspect is reinforced by the multiplicity of bright colours which are themselves signs of joy. Only if we are willing to leave our worlds, big or small, and join the other baptized on this path that leads to living the Gospel with greater authenticity and joy, will this synod be a success for our local Church/Congregation. An opportunity to revitalize the ties between those of us who celebrate together, knowing that He, made Eucharist, feed us along the way and urges us to constantly be a Iglesia en salida (Church on a mission).

This process will be a good exercise in – perhaps in many cases a beginning of – what a Church that lives its mission in synodality should be.


In the Church of the middle of the last century various lay associations for spirituality and the mission in the world arose. Pope Pius XII approves with the Provida Mater the Secular Institutes, made up of lay men and women, consecrated and associated, WHO LIVE THEIR COMMITMENT AS DISCIPLES OF CHRIST, in the material, cultural, social or health environments to be leaven in the world.

The Second Vatican Council wants to "take back" the figure, identity and mission of the laity and does so, not only in the constitution Lumen Gentium but also in the decree Apotolicam Actuositatem entirely dedicated to Christifideles. The identity dimension of the laity, is an integral part of the people of God, it makes them coresponsible for evangelisation and is the very life of the Christian Community. The laity are consecrated to form a royal priesthood and a holy nation. The formation of the "holy nation" implies communion and co-responsibility.

Pope Francis asks of the entire people of God, bishops, presbyters, religious, consecrated laity, lay people of all ages and social status: to listen to the joys and anxieties of the people of our time, who are the very recipients of the reason why Christ wanted his Church in the world, reach out to all people. As S.C.B. Associates, we too need to heed the call of the Pope, let us make the theme Participation, Communion and Mission more vibrant in our meetings and mission.
